ERRATUM – COMMISIONER FOR CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE ANNUAL REPORT 2024-2025

Following publication and tabling of the 2024-2025 Commissioner for Children and Young People Annual Report, errors were identified in the 'Summary of Key performance indicators' section, on pages 50-51. The wording for Key Performance Indicator (KPI) 1.2 was mistakenly duplicated from KPI 1.1, which meant the figures were not able to be read in alignment with the KPI Certification data found in the Financial Statements and Disclosures section of the report on pages 75-77.

For further clarity, and in order to align with the KPI Certification data found in the Financial Statements and Disclosures section of the report on pages 75-77, the second bullet point on page 16 should read:

• Extent to which issues impacting upon children and young people are researched, advocated and promoted.

Other minor edits:

There is duplication of the following paragraphs on page 83 in the section on the WA Multicultural Policy Framework. The last two bullet points should be removed:

- Implement recruitment and career development processes that support employment and progression of staff from CaLD backgrounds.
- Achieve equitable representation of people from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds at all levels and in decision making.

On page 20 there is repetition of the following paragraph:

• Key findings from the Listening Tour were that children and young people had a high level of concern about the environment, safety on public transport, mental health supports, and the cost of living.

However, it should be noted that the first paragraph is referring to the Listening Tour across the whole state of Western Australia, and the second paragraph refers to findings from children and young people in the metropolitan region specifically.
